headspace Hedland opens its doors

- headspace Hedland is open, located at 21/1 Lawson Street, South Hedland.
- headspace Hedland provides the full range of headspace services including mental health, physical and sexual health, work and study support and alcohol and other drug services.

headspace Hedland has opened its doors, providing young people, their families and friends access to youth friendly support for their mental health and wellbeing.

Anglicare WA, appointed as lead agency to run the new centre, has utilised their strong local partnerships and connection with the region's young people in the development of this new headspace service. They have been running the headspace Pilbara Outreach Program since it began in 2017 and headspace Karratha, that opened earlier this year.

headspace Hedland is centrally located near to North Regional TAFE, Hedland Senior High School, other youth friendly services and is on the public transport route. It will provide the full range of headspace services including mental health, physical and sexual health, work and study support and alcohol and other drug services.

Comments attributed to Anglicare WA CEO, Mark Glasson:

"The opening of headspace Hedland is an exciting moment for Anglicare WA, it's the first-time we've had a base to deliver services from for the local community.

"We're not new to town, we've been here for several years running the headspace Pilbara Outreach Program, Australia's first and only headspace without a bricks and mortar building. Since 2017, we've been working with young people in the places where they gather and feel safe; now, they can also come to us at the headspace Hedland centre.

"headspace Hedland is much more than the building; the service that will be delivered from the Centre is the outcome of months of community consultations and workshops involving young people and their families, other service providers, Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations, the Town of Port Hedland, WA Primary Health Alliance, and the broader community."
