Young people living in and around Manjimup will soon be able to access youth-friendly support services closer to home with a headspace centre expected to open by the end of 2025.

headspace Manjimup will provide the full range of headspace services including mental health, physical and sexual health, work and study support and alcohol and other drug services.

As the operator of WA's three Primary Health Networks, WA Primary Health Alliance will be coordinating the tender process and supporting the successful provider to establish the centre.

"That's why we're expanding the headspace network so every young person can access the mental health care they need, close to home.
